## Warning: There may be spoilers in the question!

On page 74, Heather asks Pete: "Are you a trying-to-do-God's-will Christian or one who's satisfied just having salvation?"

Do you understand what Heather is asking Pete? Have you ever thought that salvation was all there was to being a Christian? What does being a "trying-to-do-God's-will Christian" look like?

Does the Bible tell us that there is something other than eternal life involved in our salvation? What does it say about salvation's impact on our lives? What does the Bible tell us about how we learn to truly live like Christians?

## Suggestions for finding answers in the Bible:

I've created <u>a scripture chart</u> with some verses about salvation to get you started. In this case, your "Type" will be verses that specifically address what our salvation gives us rather than how we obtain it. (Remember, you aren't disregarding the verses about how we obtain salvation. They are important! They just aren't helpful in answering the immediate question.) Don't forget to look for cross-references. If you find other words that are used to mean the same thing as "salvation," look them up in the concordance too. The last page of the handout has a blank scripture chart for extra verses.
